CONSERVATION

- Members come from various organizations working in conservation and development areas, GREG would rely on individual expertise and organizations' recognition.
- GREG would coordinate with other working groups or initiatives in which its members are involved (Sangha group, CARPE country team, model forest etc).
- GREG could use tool in place such as community hunting zones (about 40000 Euros yearly from 10 CHZ).
- Communication would be performed through rural radios.

A framework for assessing conservation and development in a Congo Basin Forest Landscape

- Very little change for livelihood or conservation indicators over the period 2006 to 2008
- global economic down-turn in 2008 had **immediate** negative consequences for both local livelihoods and for biodiversity.
- Weakness of institutions, and corruption were the major obstacles to achieving either conservation or development objectives
